Pursuant to due call and notice thereof, a regular meeting of the North Mankato City Council was held in the Municipal Building Council Chambers on August 20, 2018. Mayor Dehen called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. asking that everyone join in the Pledge of Allegiance. The following were present for the meeting: Council Members Freyberg, Whitlock, Steiner, and Norland, Mayor Dehen, City Administrator Harrenstein, Finance Director McCann, Attorney Kennedy, City Engineer Sarff, Community Development Director Fischer, Public Works Director Host, and City Clerk Van Genderen.

Approval of Agenda

Council Member Norland moved, seconded by Council Member Whitlock, to approve the agenda as presented. Vote on the motion: Freyberg, Whitlock, Norland, and Dehen aye; Steiner abstain; no nays. Motion carried.

Approval of Minutes

Council Member Norland moved, seconded by Council Member Whitlock, to approve the minutes of the Council meeting of August 6, 2018. Vote on the motion: Freyberg, Whitlock, Norland and Dehen aye; Steiner abstain; no nays. Motion carried.

Public Hearing, 7 p.m. - Consider Ordinance No. 105, Amending Chapter 156, Zoning Code.

Community Development Director Fischer reported current code includes in-ground pools as a permitted use subject to being enclosed by a 6-foot high fence. A request was made to amend the code to allow the use of pool covers that are ASTM F 1346 certified. Community Development Director Fischer reported the Planning Commission reviewed and recommended the amendment. The proposed ordinance would require an "in-ground private swimming pool serving a single-family residence when completely enclosed within a fence at least 6 feet in height or an automatic pool cover installed over the entire pool surface which meets ASTM F 1346 standards." He stated in zoning districts in the R-3, R-3A or R-4 districts an "in-ground swimming pool serving a multi-family dwelling(s) when completely enclosed with a fence of at least six feet in height."

With no one appearing before Council, Mayor Dehen closed the Public Hearing.

Public Hearing, 7 p.m.-Consider Ordinance No. 106, Amending Chapter 71.05, Other Parking Restrictions.

Community Development Director Fischer stated there had been interest in amending the onstreet parking requirements. Currently, City Code on-street parking requirements state that no vehicle shall be parked more than 24 hours. If a citizen complains, the police mark the car and check if the vehicle has moved in the 24 hours. The proposed ordinance states "It is unlawful for any person to stop, park or leave standing any vehicle, boat, trailer, camper or recreational vehicle upon any street for a continuous period in excess of 24 hours. After 24 continuous hours of no movement, they are required to be relocated a minimum of one hundred (100) feet from their original location."

Doug Drill, 835 Sherman Street, appeared before Council and stated he parks a boat in front of his house and may not always move it within the 24 hours. He indicated he pays assessments for the street and should be able to utilize the streets. Mr. Drill stated that if he needs to move his boat 100ft, it would then be parked in front of his neighbors.

Vote on the motion: Freyberg, Whitlock, Steiner, Norland and Dehen aye; no nays. Motion carried.

Public Comments Concerning Business Items on the Agenda None.

Business Items

Ordinance No. 105, Amending Chapter 156, Zoning Code

Council Member Freyberg thanked Mr. Sowers for the information regarding the pool covers. He stated he still had concerns about the use of a pool cover rather than a 6-foot fence. He noted a variance the City recently granted to allow a six-foot fence to surround a property to ensure an autistic child did not wander. He stated since we know that there are children that wander we are assuming a landowner will not be distracted and forget to close a pool cover. Council Member Freyberg noted children would roam and he expressed concern that a child could drown due to non-attentive adults, especially since City Council has recognized the fact that children wander. Mayor Dehen noted he could see both sides of the argument. Council Member Norland moved, seconded by Council Member Steiner to adopt Ordinance No. 105, Amending Chapter 156, Zoning Code. Vote on the motion: Whitlock, Norland, and Dehen aye; Freyberg and Steiner nay. Motion carried.

Ordinance No. 106, Amending Chapter 71.05, Other Parking Restrictions.

Attorney Kennedy responded to a resident's comment stating the City is not suggesting people park their vehicles in front of a neighbor's home, rather residents need to locate off-street parking. Council Member Steiner noted he received several complaints and concerns about people parking in a certain location longer than 24-hours, especially from constituents in lower North Mankato. Council Member Norland noted there were issues in lower North Mankato. Mayor Dehen noted he received calls from people both supporting and against the proposed Ordinance. He stated streets are definitely for parking, but they are not locations for storage. Mayor Dehen commented he had reached out to the Police Department to hear their comments. He noted there were comments that 24 hours might be too short and 48 hours may be a better choice. Mayor Dehen stated the 100 feet is not necessarily the issue; rather the bigger issue is making sure vehicles are not parked within 100 feet of intersections or curves to help with visibility. Council Member Steiner moved, seconded by Council Member Norland to adopt Ordinance No. 106, Amending Chapter 71.05, Other Parking Restrictions. Vote on the motion: Freyberg, Whitlock, Steiner, and Norland aye; Dehen nay. Motion carried.

Preliminary and Final Plat of Nature View Subdivision No. 3, A Request from Mick Montag.

Council Member Norland moved, seconded by Council Member Whitlock to accept the Preliminary and Final Plat of Nature View Subdivision No. 3, A Request from Mick Montag. Vote on the motion: Freyberg, Whitlock, Steiner, Norland and Dehen aye; no nays. Motion carried.

Set Public Hearing for September 4, 2018, at 7:00 p.m. to Consider Ordinance No. 107, Amending Chapter 51, Refuse Collection.

Council Member Freyberg moved, seconded by Council Member Norland to set a Public Hearing for September 4, 2018, at 7:00 p.m. to Consider Ordinance No. 107, Amending Chapter 51, Refuse Collection. Vote on the motion: Freyberg, Whitlock, Steiner, Norland and Dehen aye; no nays. Motion carried.

Set a Public Hearing for September 4, 2018, at 7:00 p.m. to Consider Ordinance No. 108, Amending Chapter 33.07, Contracts with the City.

Mayor Dehen commented the Ordinance would increase the competitive bidding threshold to the rates just approved by the Minnesota State Statutes. The threshold would increase from \$100,000 to \$175,000. The previous threshold was established in 2008. Council Member Freyberg moved, seconded by Council Member Norland to Set a Public Hearing for September 4, 2018, at 7:00 p.m. to Consider Ordinance NO. 108, Amending Chapter 33.07, Contracts with the City. Vote on the motion: Freyberg, Whitlock, Steiner, Norland and Dehen aye; no nays. Motion carried.

Open Forum

Phil Henry, 1300 Noretta Drive, commented that something was eating his garden.

City Administrator and Staff Comments

Public Works Director Host appeared before Council and reported the City had completed their work on the swim facility and Global Specialties were excavating the deepest part of the facility and would continue until cold weather prevents work.

Public Works Director Host stated the Jefferson Avenue project began the week of August 13, 2018, and they are moving forward.

Mayor Dehen requested clarification on groundwater, Public Works Director Host noted the river continues to drop, but it takes longer for the groundwater levels to drop.

City Clerk Van Genderen commented that the City of North Mankato had excellent voter turnout for the Primary and thanked all of the Election Judges for their hard work during the election.

Finance Director McCann noted the draft budget would be ready for a Budget Workshop on September 4, 2018, at 6:00 p.m.

Mayor and Council Comments

Council Member Norland noted that Oak Terrace Assisted Living was awarded, in 2018, three bronze awards from the American Health Care Association.

Council Member Norland congratulated Deputy City Clerk Anderson for her efficient and helpful work with contractors. Council Member Norland stated she recently spoke with a contractor who was very complimentary.

Mayor Dehen stated he received a thank you from the Coalition of Greater Minnesota for hosting the Coalition Conference.

There being no further business, on a motion by Council Member Norland, seconded by Council Member Whitlock, the meeting was adjourned at 7:25 p.m.

- Subd. 3. **Contracts over \$100,000 \$175,000**. If the amount of the contract is estimated to exceed\$100,000 \$175,000, sealed bids shall be solicited by public notice in the manner and subject to the requirements of the law governing contracts by the particular municipality or class thereof. With regard to repairs and maintenance of ditches, the provisions of section 103E.705, subdivisions 5, 6, and 7, apply.
- Sec. 2. Minnesota Statutes 2016, section 471.345, subdivision 4, is amended to read:
- Subd. 4. Contracts exceeding \$25,000 but not \$100,000 \$175,000. If the amount of the contract is estimated to exceed \$25,000 but not to exceed \$100,000 \$175,000, the contract may be made either upon sealed bids or by direct negotiation, by obtaining two or more quotations for the purchase or sale when possible, and without advertising for bids or otherwise complying with the requirements of competitive bidding. All quotations obtained shall be kept on file for a period of at least one year after receipt thereof.
- Sec. 3. **EFFECTIVE DATE.** Sections 1 and 2 are effective August 1, 2018, and apply to contracts entered into on or after that date.

§ 33.07 CONTRACTS WITH THE CITY.

- (A) *Contracts to be in writing*. All contracts involving the city for greater than \$\frac{10,00025,000}{25,000}\$ shall be written.
- (B) Signing of contracts. All written contracts for more than \$10,00025,000 shall be signed by the Mayor and City Clerk pursuant to authority from the City Council. The corporate seal of the city shall be placed upon the contract.
- (C) Municipal contracts. A contract for the sale, purchase or rental of supplies, materials or equipment or for the construction, alteration, repair or maintenance of real or personal property shall be established in accordance with the following procedures. No provision herein shall supersede the requirement that all city and departmental expenditures must be within the parameters of the duly adopted annual budget.
- (1) Contracts less than \$10,00025,000. If the amount of the contract does not exceed \$10,00025,000, the City Administrator is authorized to directly enter into the contract in the open market without first obtaining Council approval.
- (2) Contracts from \$10,00025,000 to \$50,000175,000. If the amount of the contract is estimated to exceed \$10,00025,000 but not to exceed \$50,000175,000, the contract may be made either upon sealed bids or by direct negotiation, by obtaining 2 or more quotations for the purchase or sale when possible and without advertising for bids. All quotations shall be kept on file for at least 1 year.
- (3) Contracts over \$50,000175,000. If the amount of the contract is estimated to exceed \$50,000175,000, sealed bids shall be solicited by public notice published.
- (D) Special rules for assessment contracts. When the Council determines to make an improvement and to assess the cost of the improvement against the benefitted property, then the following special rules shall applyrequirements and procedures concerning creation of the improvement contract shall be in accordance with the requirements of M.S. § 429.041, as it may be amended from time to time.
- (1) Contracts of \$50,000 or less. If the estimated cost of the improvement is \$25,000 or less, then the provisions concerning municipal contracts shall apply.
- (2) Contracts from \$50,000 to \$100,000. If the estimated cost of the improvement is from \$50,000 to \$100,000, the City Council shall advertise for bids on the city's website for such length of time as it may deem advisable.
- (3) Contracts over \$100,000. If the improvement contract exceeds \$100,000, sealed bids shall be solicited by public notice published at least once on the city's website, at least 3 weeks before the last day for submission of bids.

About:

An audio permit is required for anyone operating outdoor amplified sound (i.e., a loudspeaker, public address system, or sound amplifying equipment). All Audio Permits must be approved by the Council. The sound system cannot be operated before 7:00 am or after 10:00 pm. There is a \$25 fee.

Audio Permit Responsibilities:

- An onsite event coordinator must be available by mobile during the event.
- An applicant will provide a schedule of any music or entertainment proposed to occur during the event.
- A beginning and end time must be supplied on the application, and the event coordinator must ensure compliance.
- Applicants must comply with City Code Ordinance 90.045 and Minnesota Rules Chapter 7030 which limits noise.
- Noise levels cannot exceed 60 dBA more than 50 percent of the time.

What happens if there is a noise complaint?

- A North Mankato Patrol Officer will meet with the complainant and evaluate and measure the noise using a decibel reader at the location of the complainant.
- If the noise is found out of compliance, the Patrol Officer will contact the onsite event coordinator, and the amplified sound must be turned down.
- If the onsite event coordinator does not comply, the event will be immediately terminated, and the group will be disbursed.
- Failure to comply will affect future ability to obtain an audio permit.

On Tuesday, August 21, 2018, the Traffic & Safety Committee met to discuss one item of business. Traffic & Safety Committee members present: Community Member Bill Borchardt, Police Chief Ross Gullickson, Public Works Director Nate Host and Community Development Director Mike Fischer.

The following is a summary of the meeting:

1. Request to review the intersection of North Ridge Drive & Quail Roost Drive.

Staff presented a request from Harry Chromy, 2231 Snowbird Lane to review the intersection of North Ridge Drive & Quail Roost Drive including the elimination of on-street parking on a part of North Ridge Drive to increase visibility. The Traffic & Safety Committee discussed one other area no parking area, the effect of losing on-street parking, precedent set for approving such a request, crosswalks, speed limit, no recent traffic accidents and the design of North Ridge Drive. The Committee held continued discussion related to visibility at the intersection including the potential to create a no parking area on North Ridge Drive as requested.

RECOMMENDATION

The Traffic & Safety Committee recommends that the applicant continue to monitor and photograph safety issues at the intersection for future review by the Committee.

1. Review intersection of North Ridge Drive & Quail Roost Drive

Attached is a written request and photograph from Harry Chromy to review the existing conditions at the intersection of North Ridge Drive and Quail Roost Drive and create a "No Parking" area on North Ridge Drive. Also attached is a map showing the intersection. In summary, the applicant believes there are safety issues at this intersection due to on-street parking of vehicles on North Ridge Drive near the intersection. Specifically, difficulties making a left turn onto North Ridge Drive from Quail Roost Drive.

According to the Police Department, within the past 10 years, there have been no traffic accidents except for a vehicle losing control on icy conditions.

As the applicant specifically proposes the elimination of on-street parking near an intersection, consideration should be given to the precedent for similar requests that could be set if the request is approved.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends consideration be given to the lack of traffic accidents reported at this intersection and the precedent for similar requests if approved.

Hello Mark:

I want to report a potential road hazard in the Northridge Addition in North Mankato. It is on the corner of Quail Roost Drive and Northridge Drive (three blocks down from Lookout). At issue is a viewing obstruction when taking a left hand turn off of Quail Roost on Northridge when a larger vehicle is parked near the southwest bound side of Northridge Drive. Attached is a picture of this intersection.

When a vehicle is parked near this intersection, you have to creep up to see around it while at the same time you have to be cognizant of vehicles driving from the other direction. Sometimes people drive above the posted speed limit on Northridge which make turning onto Northridge dangerous at that intersection at times. The worst times are mornings and on icy winter mornings. The other thing that makes this intersection dangerous is that there is a bend in the road whereby you view is obstructed when larger vehicles are parked there - I think my picture points this out.

I propose that no parking be allowed on 20' – 40' on that SW bound stretch of Northridge (where the vehicle in the attached picture is shown). I know that this may be an inconvenience for people who normally park there but I think public safety trumps that right to park there. This would reduce the risk of turning on to Northridge Drive at that intersection.

Thank you for hearing my concern and forwarding this to the appropriate decision makers.





ORDINANCE NO. 107, FOURTH SERIES

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF NORTH MANKATO, MINNESOTA, AMENDING NORTH MANKATO CITY CODE, TITLE V, PUBLIC WORKS, CHAPTER 51, REFUSE COLLECTION

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH MANKATO, MINNESOTA, ORDAINS:

Section 1. Sections of North Mankato City Code, Title V, Public Works, Chapter 51, Refuse Collection are hereby amended as follows:

- (A) All refuse shall be stored in rust-resistant, water-tight, non-absorbent and washable closed containers, approved for the purpose by the city.
- (B) All containers shall not be stored in any front yard building setback except the day of scheduled pick-up and the day previous

A new law, HF 3841, increases the competitive bidding threshold from \$100,000 to \$175,000. It was signed into law by Gov. Dayton as Chapter 107 on April 26. The competitive bidding threshold had not been increased since 2008. Construction costs have increased at a greater rate than general cost of living. Small construction projects easily hit the current threshold of \$100,000. The League of Minnesota Cities supported this bill. The new law takes effect on Aug, 1, 2018, and applies to contracts entered into on or after that date. Attached is a copy of Chapter 107 showing the revisions to Minnesota State Statutes 2016, section 471.345.

Chapter 33.07 of the North Mankato City Code defines the bidding thresholds for contracts involving the City. The thresholds in Chapter 33.07 are significantly less than those defined in the Minnesota State Statutes. Chapter 33.07 was last updated in 1994, and it is estimated that construction costs have escalated by a factor of approximately 210% since that time. City staff is recommending that Chapter 33.07 be revised such that the bidding requirements for the City are consistent with the recently revised Minnesota State Statutes Section 471.345.

Attached is a copy of Chapter 33.07 showing the proposed revisions.

Recommended Action: Set Public Hearing for September 4, 2018, 7:00 p.m., to Consider Ordinance No. 108, Amending Chapter 33.07, Contracts with the City.

ORDINANCE NO. 108, FOURTH SERIES

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF NORTH MANKATO, MINNESOTA, AMENDING NORTH MANKATO CITY CODE, TITLE III, ADMINISTRATION, CHAPTER 33, CONTRACTS WITH THE CITY

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH MANKATO, MINNESOTA, ORDAINS:

Section 1. Sections of North Mankato City Code, Title III, Administration, Chapter 33.07, Contracts with the City are hereby amended as follows:

- (A) Contracts to be in writing. All contracts involving the city for greater than \$25,000 shall be written.
- (B) Signing of contracts. All written contracts for more than \$25,000 shall be signed by the authorized agent designated by the City Council.
- (C) Municipal contracts. A contract for the sale, purchase or rental of supplies, materials or equipment or for the construction, alteration, repair or maintenance of real or personal property shall be established in accordance with the following procedures. No provision herein shall supersede the requirement that all city and departmental expenditures must be within the parameters of the duly adopted annual budget.
- (1) Contracts less than \$25,000. If the amount of the contract does not exceed \$25,000, the City Administrator is authorized to directly enter into the contract in the open market without first obtaining Council approval.
- (2) Contracts from \$25,000 to \$175,000. If the amount of the contract is estimated to exceed \$25,000 but not to exceed \$175,000, the contract may be made either upon sealed bids or by direct negotiation, by obtaining 2 or more quotations for the purchase or sale when possible and without advertising for bids. All quotations shall be kept on file for at least 1 year.
- (3) Contracts over\$175,000. If the amount of the contract is estimated to exceed \$175,000, sealed bids shall be solicited by public notice published.
- (D) Special rules for assessment contracts. When the Council determines to make an improvement and to assess the cost of the improvement against the benefitted property, then the requirements and procedures concerning creation of the improvement contract shall be in accordance with the requirements of M.S. § 429.041, as it may be amended from time to time.

Section 2. After adoption, signing and attestation, this Ordinance shall be published once in the official newspaper of the City and shall be in effect on or after the date following such publication.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This Memorandum of Understanding is entered into as of August _______, 2018, by and between Twin Rivers Council for the Arts, a Minnesota Nonprofit Corporation ("*Twin Rivers*") and City of North Mankato, a Municipal Corporation ("*North Mankato*"). Twin Rivers and North Mankato are at times individually referred to as "*Party*" and jointly as "*Parties*".

RECITALS

- A. Twin Rivers is a community non-profit organization that provides consulting services on matters relating to arts and culture.
- B. North Mankato desires to retain Twin Rivers as a consultant and facilitator on a contractual basis ("*Consulting Services*") on specific arts and cultural projects ("*Public Art Project*").
- C. Twin Rivers coordinated, advised and assisted North Mankato with planning and adoption of the North Mankato Public Arts Idea Plan ("Public Arts Plan").
- D. Twin Rivers agrees to provide Consulting Services on Public Art Projects in accordance with the Public Arts Plan.
- E. Twin Rivers and North Mankato now desire to memorialize the terms of the Consulting Services.
- **NOW, THEREFORE,** in consideration of the above-recitals, the promises contained herein and for all the good and valuable consideration, the Parties agree as follows:
- 1. North Mankato hereby retains Twin Rivers to provide Consulting Services relating to the Public Arts Plan on a per project basis. North Mankato shall pay Twin Rivers a Consulting Services fee for the Consulting Services on a per project basis. Attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein by reference is the Public Art Project form, which the Parties shall complete for each Public Art Project ("*Project Fee*").
- 2. The Parties shall jointly approve the Public Art Project. Once a Public Art Project is approved, Twin Rivers shall take the necessary action to implement the Public Art Project, which may include:
 - a. Consulting with North Mankato.
 - b. Overseeing the Public Art Project.
 - c. Contracting with artists.
 - d. Paying artists from the Project Fee.
 - e. Obtaining consent of property owners for placement of the Public Art Project.

- 3. Upon completion of each Public Art Project, Twin Rivers shall transfer and surrender all rights to the Public Art Project to North Mankato and shall have no further responsibilities or obligations relating to the Public Art Project. North Mankato shall be responsible for any and all future maintenance and care of the Public Art Project.
- 4. North Mankato retains the exclusive right to decommission any Public Art Project at its discretion.

ORDINANCE NO. 109, FOURTH SERIES

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF NORTH MANKATO, MINNESOTA, AMENDING NORTH MANKATO CITY CODE, TITLE XV, LAND USAGE, CHAPTER 154, SIGN REGULATIONS

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH MANKATO, MINNESOTA, ORDAINS:

Section 1. Sections of North Mankato City Code, Title XV, Land Usage, Chapter 154, Sign Regulations are hereby amended as follows:

§ 154.05 PROHIBITED SIGNS.

The following signs shall be prohibited:

(F) Painting directly on exterior walls, except for public art murals approved by the City.

Section 2. After adoption, signing and attestation, this Ordinance shall be published once in the official newspaper of the City and shall be in effect on or after the date following such publication.

§ 154.05 PROHIBITED SIGNS.

The following signs shall be prohibited:

- (A) All off-premises advertising signs including billboards;
- (B) Fence signs;
- (C) Flashing signs;
- (D) Signs which interfere with traffic signs, signals or devices;
- (E) Marquee signs;
- (F) Painting directly on exterior walls, except for public art murals approved by the City;
- (G) Paper, cardboard, or similar signs, notices, or flyers pasted, tacked, or otherwise attached to the exterior wall of any building, utility poles or traffic signs;
- (H) Permanent or temporary signs overhanging the public right-of-way or boundary of adjacent property, except traffic signs erected by the city, county, or state;
 - (I) Revolving beacons and sequential flashers;
 - (J) Revolving signs;
 - (K) Roof signs;
- (L) Where a business is located over more than 1 parcel or lot, the business shall not be entitled to additional signs nor a multiplicity of square footage of signage by virtue thereof;
 - (M) Lighted signs in residential zoning districts, except churches or schools;
- (N) Signs or advertising painted or attached to vehicles parked on a property not intended to be moved for a period of 48 hours or more;
 - (O) Dynamic display signs over 125 square feet;
 - (P) Dynamic display signs in residential zoning districts; and
 - (Q) Dynamic display off-premises signs.
